Miller served as the Deputy Commanding General of the 38th Infantry Division and is a Combat Veteran with service in Afghanistan.

AUSA Region 2 encompasses a diverse and extensive community of 256,000 individuals, including military personnel, civilians, active-duty members, reservists, guardsmen, and veterans. The region spans Washington D.C., Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, Tennessee, Maryland, Virginia, and West Virginia.

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FROM SERVICE TO STARTUPS: INSIDE THE TEXAS VETERANS COMMISSION VETERAN ENTREPRENEUR PROGRAM

Megan Tamez, Director of the Veteran Entrepreneur Program (VEP) at the Texas Veterans Commission (TVC), is passionately committed to empowering veterans to succeed in business. Megan's journey with the TVC began in September 2014, following her return to Texas as a veteran and military spouse. The TVC provided crucial support during this transition by helping Megan find her calling with a position assisting fellow veterans, eventually leading her to helm the VEP in May 2022.

The Veteran Entrepreneur Program is a specialized initiative within the TVC that provides comprehensive support, resources, and guidance to veteran entrepreneurs at every stage of their business journey, from startup to growth and expansion.

VEP stands out for its peer-based support system, which includes accredited small business consultants who are, themselves, veterans. This approach ensures that VEP staff deeply understands the unique challenges veteran entrepreneurs face. VEP offers a range of services, from verifying veterans' eligibility for the Texas Veteran Verification Letter, to waive state formation fees and the first five years of franchise tax, to certifying businesses as TVC-verified veteran-owned.

Megan and her team are committed to making the entrepreneurial process as smooth as possible for veterans. This year, each member of the Entrepreneur Program became certified as a small business consultant through the Association of Accredited Small Business Consultants (AASBC), enhancing their ability to provide expert guidance. Tamez said, "The VEP program has also restructured its operations and

improved its online database, significantly reducing wait times and enabling more efficient service delivery."

Outreach is a critical component of VEP's strategy. The program actively conducts presentations, classes, and events, working with community partners across Texas to share the TVC's mission and resources. This proactive approach ensures that veterans across the state are aware of and can access the support they need to launch and grow their businesses.

Megan's leadership is guided by a deep commitment to the holistic success of veteran entrepreneurs. VEP's mission is not just about business success; it's about empowering veterans to leverage their unique skills and experiences to build thriving enterprises that contribute to their communities.

CHUCK WRIGHT: SERVING TEXAS VETERANS WITH DEDICATION AND VISION

Chuck Wright, Texas Veterans Commission, is at the helm of one of the state's most vital agencies, guiding its mission to serve the largest population of veterans in the United States. Appointed by Governor Greg Abbott in March of 2024, Wright's leadership is instrumental in ensuring that the Texas Veterans Commission (TVC) continues to provide comprehensive services to over 1.5 million veterans across the state.

Wright's goal as Commissioner is clear: to increase awareness of the TVC's role and ensure that every veteran in Texas receives the benefits they have earned. Under Wright's direction, the TVC has made significant strides in supporting veterans through a wide array of programs. From assisting veterans in filing disability claims and navigating VA healthcare to providing resources for education, employment, and entrepreneurship, the TVC covers every aspect of a veteran's life.

This commitment was highlighted last May when the Commission approved 181 grants totaling \$44.2 million, projected to serve nearly 42,000 veterans across Texas. These grants are a testament to the agency's dedication to addressing the needs of veterans, from mental health services to business support. As Wright emphasized, "There's a reason why more veterans call Texas home than any other state. We are here for our veterans to ensure they get the benefits they earned through service."

Wright's journey to becoming a Texas Veterans Commissioner is rooted in a deep-seated passion for serving veterans. Before his current role, he spent eight years on the TVC's Fund for Veteran Assistance Advisory Committee, where he helped allocate millions of dollars to veteran-serving organizations. His military background serving as a CH 46 pilot in the United States Marine Corps, coupled with his professional experience as the founder of a retirement income planning firm, uniquely positions him to understand and advocate for the needs of Texas veterans.

Reflecting on his mission, Wright shared, "Serving veterans is my primary passion. I've been blessed with an exciting military career and a fulfilling business

career, and now I have the honor of giving back to my fellow servicemen and women through the Texas Veterans Commission."

Wright's personal history is as rich as his professional one. A seventh-generation Texan, Wright's roots trace back to one of Austin's "Old 300," with a lineage steeped in the legacy of Texas. After growing up the son of an Air Force member and traveling the world, Wright returned to Texas to complete his education before joining the Marine Corps, where he earned his wings and completed two WESTPAC deployments.

Throughout his career, Wright has been recognized for his contributions, including receiving the Congressional Veteran Commendation Award from Congressman Michael Burgess and being a finalist for the Soldier-Citizen Award by the American College of Financial Services.

As Commissioner, Wright continues to build on the Texas Veterans Commission's legacy, ensuring that veterans across the state can access the resources and support they need. His leadership, combined with a lifelong dedication to service, underscores the importance of the TVC's mission and its impact on the lives of Texas veterans.

"Charlie Mike... continue the mission," Wright often says, echoing his commitment to the cause. The Texas Veterans Commission is poised to do just that — continue the mission of serving those who have served.
